


Celebrating a Community Legacy in a Roundabout Way

By reducing congestion delays and noxious emissions (by 33%) the community benefits from a healthier environment and a leader in slowing climate change.





The operational benefits include a 30%-50% increase in vehicle capacity. Safety benefits of reduced accidents and injury saves the community real dollars.





As a nexus for multi-modal travel the Circle is essential to highway safety improvements along approach roads, including a proposed Arroyo Burro Trail (a Chumash legacy route).





As a gateway to the popular Hendry's Beach and other coastal access, the Circle will welcome a wide range of community travellers: bikers, hikers, surfers and swimmers, bowsers and their best friends.





Crashes and injuries are drastically reduced by the slower travel speed and improved travel path and visibility of cars, bikes, and pedestrians.






Adjacent to cherished resource lands, the calming humm of the Circle will be an added value (superior to the screech and growl of the alternatives), and blend-in with native plant landscape.
